

# COVID Vaccination and Testing for Dallas County Residents

## How to Register for a Vaccination

COVID-19 Vaccine is still in very limited supply and is still being prioritized. High priority for vaccine immediate availability includes; doctors, nurses, first responders, as well as individuals 65 and older and 18 or older with an underlying medical condition. Dallas County is distributing the Moderna vaccine at this time, which is only available to individuals 18 and older.

Each entity that is distributing the vaccine may approach this process differently, so if you plan to receive your immunization from a hospital, pharmacy or doctor, it will be a different registration process.

## Criteria for Testing

*Testing is open to anyone who is over the age of 5 and lives within the boundaries of the City of Dallas or Dallas County.*

Exceptions to the residency requirements:

- First responders, DART drivers, healthcare workers, and all CISA essential workers; must have a work ID and must work in Dallas County/City of Dallas.
- City of Dallas and Dallas County employees; must provide a valid work ID.
